From marquetry doors inlaid with a ginkgo motif to starlight headliners reflecting the Hong Kong sky on historic Peninsula dates, every detail is steeped in meaning and refinement.



Inside, guests are cocooned in handcrafted leather, mother-of-pearl accents, and a silk-embroidered Gallery depicting the hotel's iconic facade — each element chosen to reflect The Peninsula's legacy of elegance and discretion.
