Bonhams at Geneva 8th March 2004 - Preview



On home territory, Bonhams Europe will host their usual sale at Geneva's Musée de l'Automobile during the second week of the annual Motor Show which, as Simon Kidston puts it, 'raises the curtain every March on the European motoring season'. A significant proportion of the sale is the Carlo Talamo collection - that includes such gems as a 1992 AC Cobra MkIV at SFR90.000 - 100.000.

Carlo Talamo was an Italian entrepreneur who was responsible primarily for Harley-Davidson's sales success in Italy from 1984 to the present day, and also that of British motorcycle manufacturer Triumph since the early 1990s. By building up a business empire based on these two marques (as well as importing and selling Rolls-Royce and Bentleys), Talamo was able to indulge his passion for powerful cars. Sadly dying in a motorcycling accident in 2002, at the early age of forty-nine, his car collection is eclectic and individual - as can be seen by some of the entries at the Geneva Sale.

The **AC Cobra MkIV** is an example of sheer horsepower and extravagance, as is the **1997 Chrysler Viper GTS**, SFR80.000 - 100.000, but the little **1981 Fiat 500 595 Barchetta** (SFR12.000 - 15.000), specially converted in the UK in 1994, is a typically quirky car that only a serial entrepreneur and individualist could order. Who else would marry a very turquoise **1968 Riley Elf MkIII** (SFR8.000 - 10.000) with a **2002 Chrysler Prowler**, finished in 'Prowler Purple Metallic' (SFR70.000 - 90.000) in their collection? True to his business interests there is also a **1991 Bentley Continental Convertible**, at SFR130.000 - 160.000, and a **1994 Rolls-Royce Corniche Turbo** (SFR140.000 - 170.000). The latter a very rare car, chassis #0 of a series of 15 R-R convertibles fitted with the Bentley Turbo R sports saloon motor.



Moving to the other lots, a **1968 Ferrari 365GT 2+2** (SFR45.000 - 55.000) opens proceedings. Finished in dark red, the car has been re-trimmed in black leather and a looks every inch the elegant boulevardier. Another Maranello car is the **1966 Ferrari 275GTB Alloy Berlinetta**, at SFR300.000 - 400.000, this time in bright red. First registered on 3rd January 1966, chassis 7927 received alloy long-nose coachwork and was originally finished in Celeste (light blue) with blue leather.
