Clocking-up its double-decade this year, the celebration of Italian style in Monterey featured the Lamborghini Miura, recognising its 40th birthday, as well as other Italian icons - like the Stradivarius violin.

Although the show has been running for twenty years, it's only been at this location for the last three, and organised by the Wadsworth family for the last two. By all accounts this year's Concorso was one of the best yet, with improved traffic and spectator flow, even bigger displays, and a slight move up-market - without losing the event's natural friendliness in a Monterey week that sometimes borders on the exclusive.

'Best of Show' went to a unique **1954 Maserati A6G 2000 Zagato Spyder** (owned by Angelo Ferro) that you can see below, while a measure of the importance of the event was the presence of the white pearlescent **Lamborghini Concept S** with its designer Luc Donckerwolke.



Next year's Concorso, held on August 18th at the Bayonet Black Horse Golf Course, Monterey Bay, is likely to be bigger and better still. It will feature cars that have competed in the **Targa Floria** via a **Targa Florio Special Display**, as well as recognising 100 years of **Lancia**, and a special **Zagato Display** for all things designed and influenced by the great Italian styling house.









