Goodwood Festival of Speed 2006

It's that time again. Clocks are going forward, the sky is blue and all's well with the world. Perhaps that's overstating the case a little, but this week, in a corner of West Sussex that is forever (British Racing) green, Lord March unveiled his plans for this summer's Festival of Speed. As usual the event is a mix of old and new, with the latest supercars mixing it with veterans from the dawn of motoring time and examples of modern F1, saloon and Le Mans cars.

As always the **Goodwood Road Racing Company** give the event a Theme. This year it's **'Racing for Glory - 100 years of Grand Prix'**. As 'any fule kno', the first GP was held in France (Le Mans actually) in 1906 and the aim of the organisers is to bring as many significant cars and drivers as possible together to celebrate that fact. So starting with a **1906 Mercedes** you can expect a multi-coloured history lesson via the **Bugattis** and **Alfa Romeos** of the 1920s, through the **Silver Arrow Mercedes** and **Auto Unions** of the '30s, the **Vanwalls**, **Ferraris** and **Maseratis** of the '50s, **BRMs**, **Lotuses** and **Coopers** of the '60s and so on. Right up to date with current F1 teams from **BMW**, **Ferrari**, **Honda**, **McLaren-Mercedes**, **Red Bull**, **Renault**, **Toyota** and **Williams**.



And as in Festivals past, many of the current race or test drivers will be on hand to drive the cars and sign autographs.

Other anniversaries to be celebrated will include 100 years of that fabulous road-race around Sicily, the **Targa Florio**, (and yes, **Nino Vaccarella** will be there), and 40 years of the **TransAm** and **CanAm** series from the United States and Canada. Cars to be demonstrated in these categories will include the **Boss 302 Mustang** and **Plymouth Barracuda**, and on the two-seater prototype front the original **Lola T70 Spyder** and orange **McLaren M8s**. And **Porsche** have promised the 1,000 BHP **917/30** that Derek Bell has demonstrated in the past.

Renault – riding high on Formula One success this year – will have the honour of providing the *sculpture* in front of Goodwood House, while the **World Rally Championship** teams will be present in force not only in the paddock and up the hill, but also on the popular Forest Rally Stage – a new feature for 2005 that was designed to provide even more entertainment on the day as well as drawing crowds away from the track areas. Legendary rally champion **Hannu Mikkola** is acting as Goodwood's consultant on a forestry stage that has been totally revised and lengthened over the winter.



Manufacturer involvement has always been at the heart of the success of the Goodwood Festival, and as before the world's manufacturers will be opening their museum doors to the organisers. An Editor's Choice would include:

The **Supercar Run** is always an opportunity to see today's high performance cars driven on the track in the manner they were designed for, away from the glass and chrome of the showroom. The exciting news is that **Ferrari** will be using the opportunity to launch the wonderful **F599 GTB** in the UK, and will also have the 'super-Enzo' **FXX**. **Bugatti** will have a **Veyron**, **Audi** are hoping to bring the new **R8** road supercar, and racing, rallying and bespoke engineering company bar-none **Prodrive** will have their one-off (fully functioning) **P2** concept car.

The 12th **Cartier 'Style et Luxe'** concours will be celebrating 40 years of the **Lamborghini Miura**, as well as having a real 'Pebble' car entered, the one-off **'Round Door Rolls'** built by Belgian coachbuilder Henri Jonckheere in the 1930s. This year's celebrity judges include long-time car fans **George Lucas** and **David Linley**.

Bonhams will be having their Friday auction as usual, an early entry being the **1966 AC Cobra Mk II**, one of only 42 RHD MkIIs built for the British market.
