London to Silverstone Supercar Tour

If your love of supercars is equalled only by a love of international sportscar racing, then the annual London to Silverstone Supercar Tour will be your idea of heaven. Starting from St James's Square, Pall Mall, after a hearty breakfast at the Royal Automobile Club, the drivers and passengers of 50 supercars will make their way out of London with the advantage of a Police motorcycle escort: a sort of low-emission congestion zone in reverse. Once you've been ushered through the Capital by a Police escort, in fact, you'll quickly come to realise that it's the *only* way to travel.

Avoiding the motorways, the route to **Silverstone** will include coffee stops at **Chalfont St Peter** and **Towcester racecourse**, setting you up nicely for a few high-speed laps of the full Grand Prix circuit once you arrive. But this is no ordinary track day at Silverstone: it's the official practice day of the only UK round of the **FIA GT Championship**, the ultimate international sportscar series. The winners of the weekend's race will not only gain important points in the opening round of the Championship, they will also be awarded the **Royal Automobile Club's** prestigious **Tourist Trophy**. This is one of the biggest events in Silverstone's calendar.



While you enjoy your lunch and afternoon refreshments in **Silverstone's 'Brooklands' hospitality suite**, you will be able to watch the **Maserati MC12s**, **Corvettes**, **Saleens** and the rest, battling it out on track for the best grid positions. Our money, though, is on the **Aston Martin DBR9** of **Gigawave MotorSport** – the only UK-based team in the GT1 category (hence the Union Flag on the bonnet). It's the team's debut season but in this month's first official test day at Monza, the **Gigawave MotorSport DBR9** was second quickest overall... a pretty good start, straight out of the box, as they say.

To be part of the **2008 London to Silverstone Supercar Tour** (assuming you have a car of the right calibre...), it costs a very reasonable £395 inc VAT per car. This covers the driver and one passenger. The price includes parking in St James's Square, breakfast at the **Royal Automobile Club**, the Police escort, entry to Silverstone, laps of the circuit, lunch and refreshments. Judging by past years, it's an excellent day out.
