## Bonhams & Butterfields at Quail Lodge - 15th August 2008 -Preview

## A superb 340+ page catalogue showcases Bonhams' 2008 Quail sale. The E2A has been getting all the attention, but in addition to the famous ex-works Jaguar there's a multitude of high-class entries, such as this 1961 Aston Martin DB4 GT, estimated at \$1,500,000 - 2,000,000.

Delivered new to the US (although a RHD car) in 1961, the dark blue Aston has spent the last 20 years in continuous ownership Stateside. Despite its club racing preparation, it's been on the concours field - rather than the track - where DB4/GT/0156/R has seen most action. Bonhams famously sold a more 'street' '4GT at <u>Newport Pagnell this year for £1,079,500</u>. I shall be interested to see what happens to this one.



We previewed the entry of the one-off, ex-Le Mans **1960 Jaguar E2A** elsewhere on Classic Driver. It's officially 'Refer Department'; however, Bonhams' early publicity hinted at a price of \$7m-plus. I've no reason to dispute that, as it's a truly historic car that can be driven on the road as well as being eligible for all the big historic racing events, including the **Le Mans Classic** (next run in 2010, the car's 50th. Hint...).

Other post-War competition cars entered include the **ex-NART, Posey/Rodriguez 2nd in class, 1969 24** Hours of Daytona, 1967 Ferrari 275GTB/4 (Refer Dept.), the **ex-James Garner/American** International Racing (AIR) Leslie/Guldstrand, 24 Hours of Daytona, FIA GT, 1967 Chevrolet Corvette L88 Competition Convertible (\$700,000 - 900,000), and the 1976 Porsche Type 934/5, a car with an incredible history in period, estimated at \$525,000 - 600,000

Bonhams has - probably wisely - decided to major on its traditional strengths of top quality pre- and post-War European cars in 2008, rather than enter the 'American Muscle' arena, a market well-served by indigenous houses such as **RM**, **Gooding** and **Russo & Steele**.

The catalogue includes a superb collection of **Voisins**, including the best-in-class winner at **Pebble Beach** in 2006, the **1931 C14 'Chartre'** (\$900,000 - 1,400,000), as well as the **ex-Ecurie Nice 1939 Talbot-Lago T150 C** (\$3,500,000 - 4,500,000), and a car once described as "the most famous Lagonda of all": the **Fox & Nicholl Team Car 'EPE 97', 1936 Lagonda LG45R Rapide** (\$1,200,000 - 1,500,000).

There are also two of the most fabulous inter-War Rolls-Royces: the ex-Maharaja Bahador of Jammu and Kashmir - Streamlined Experimental, 1928 Rolls-Royce Phantom I Torpedo (Refer Dept.), and the 1933 Monte Carlo Rally, 1930 Rolls-Royce Phantom II Continental Sportsman's Coupé for \$800,000 - 1,200,000.

Prior to the motor cars, Bonhams will sell a variety of jewellery and watches, and automobilia. The latter includes a selection of car mascots by **René Lalique** and Lot 177: **a Porsche 917 steering wheel from the movie 'Le Mans'**. This is signed by Steve McQueen – and others – and carries an estimate of \$20,000 – 30,000.
