Coys at Blenheim Palace 16 July 2011: Preview

1965 Jaguar E-type Series I 4.2 Litre Roadster: £45,000 - £55,000

'The Jaguar Legend' is the subtitle to Coys' forthcoming Blenheim Palace sale, and it's a well-timed one, as the British company is riding high in the sales charts for modern cars and this year celebrates the sublime E-type's 50th.

Yes, they did make a lot of E-types, but part of the pleasure of ownership is finding a good one, and Coys has 10 to choose from at Blenheim. The selection starts with a 1971 Series III 2+2 (£10,000 - 15,000) and goes all the way up to a clearly beautifully prepared, 'Refer Dept.' 1961 SI 'Aluminium lightweight Roadster'.

The car you see at the top of the page, a 1965 Series I 4.2 Litre Roadster ticks all the boxes: nice mid-range estimate of £45,000 - £55,000; perfect colour combination of Opalescent Silver Grey over red hide; a left-hand drive, original 'dry state' car. The vendor is awaiting new chrome wire wheels and tyres which will be fitted prior to sale – a nice E-type.

1977 Alpine A 110 Renault: £35,000 - 40,000 'Chitty Chitty Bang Bang' Display Vehicle, Beaulieu Motor Museum: 'Refer Dept.'

The other Jaguars include four XK120 Roadsters with estimates ranging from £48,000 to £80,000 and a 1959 XK150 Drop Head Coupé for £45,000 - 50,000.

Jaguar saloon enthusiasts have a good number of cars to look at, too, with some interesting entries that include a good, 'fun' historic racer (the 1959 MK I at £17,000 - 22,000), a manual + overdrive 1958 Mk VIII (rare, and do I hear "a lot of car for the money" at £13,000 - 22,000?) and the getaway driver's favourite, a 1967 Jaguar MK 2 3.8 manual + overdrive (£8000 - 15,000? - a steal).

1967 Lancia Flaminia Touring Convertible: £35,000 - 40,000 1951 Jaguar XK120 Roadster: £48,000 - £55,000

In all, 22 cars in the 85-car catalogue are Jaguars, so there are plenty of other entries for those not bitten by the Jaguar bug. One of the highlights is the concours-winning, two-owner 1989 Ferrari F 40. 'Refer Dept.' for price on this one please, a Ferrari Classiche-certified car which has covered just over 3500 miles in the last 20 years.

Other Ferraris include two 512 'Boxers' (a 1978 carb car for £70,000 - 85,000 and a 1982 'i' for £65,000 - 75,000) and an Argento-with-blue-hide 1971 365 GTB/4 'Daytona' at £150,000 - 170,000.

1989 Ferrari F40 - Two-Owner Ferrari Concours Winner: 'Refer Dept.'

Reinforcing its longstanding reputation as a pre-War car specialist, Coys will offer a variety of elegant motor cars, perfectly suited to the stately home surroundings at Blenheim. The 1927 Rolls-Royce Phantom I Open Tourer by Hooper & Co (£140,000 - 170,000) is one of three pre-War Phantoms catalogued, while the 1931 Bentley 8 Litre - originally supplied to HRH the Duke of Kent - is pretty much everyone's idea of a vintage Bentley, all for £600,000 - 700,000.

1931 Frazer Nash Pre-War Boulogne II: £95,000 - 110,000 1953 Bentley R Type Continental, Fastback by Mulliner: £290,000 - 330,000

Eight Aston Martins will make their way to Blenheim, and prospective buyers will be able to choose from the entry-level-to-Newport-Pagnell-Aston-ownership 1990 Virage Coupé (£12,000 - 15,000) to the £95,000 - 115,000, 1958 DB Mk III. There's also the saleroom's favourite, a 'barn find', in the form of the LHD 1958 DB Mark III, originally sold into Canada and only recently repatriated from the Toronto region, for £60,000 - 80,000.

1958 Aston Martin DB Mark III: £60,000 - 80,000

Of the other entries, we rather fancy the 1967 Lancia Flaminia Touring Convertible (£35,000 - 40,000), appreciate the Gallic sportiness of the 1977 Alpine-Renault A110 (£35,000 - 40,000) and look forward to Chris Routledge and Douglas Jamieson performing an impromptu version of *Me Ol' Bam-Boo* when Lot 166,

the 'Refer Dept.' Chitty Chitty Bang Bang Display Vehicle comes up for sale.
