Twice the price of the most exclusive Cadillac and a substantial amount more expensive than the sporting 300 SL 'Gullwing' when it was introduced, the 300 S was destined for the Jet Set. This car was purchased by a German businessman and shareholder of Daimler-Benz, perhaps as a company car or, as we'd like to believe, a lavish gift for one of his (female?) subsidiaries. It's resided in France with the same German owner since 1982, during which time it's been regularly exercised, cherished and enjoyed.
