Along with a no-reserve, 11-car private collection, christened 'A Century of Sports Cars', which RM Sotheby's announced in October 2017, there are two other collections in the 129-car sale — another private collection and a trio of cars from the Neil & Patricia DeAtley Collection. While the sports car collection is filled with such decade-spanning icons as a 1964 Ferrari 250 GT/L Berlinetta Lusso (est. 1.8–2.2m US dollars) and a 2002 Ferrari 575M Maranello (est. 350,000-450,000 dollars), the trio from the Neil & Patricia DeAtley Collection is comprised of pre-War American beauties, as is the second private collection — with a few oddities thrown in there as well. Along with Packards, Auburns, Cadillacs, and Lincolns, there's a Bellatrix Yellow Toyota 2000GT (est. 600,000-700,000 dollars), as well as a handful of vintage neon signs. Outside of the collections, the star of the show would have to be the beautiful Big Cat 1954 Works Jaguar D-type (est. 12–15m dollars) that the company announced in November.
